

## Delightful Window Box



Nothing cheers me up more than looking at flowers. Their simple beauty is humbling. This little project with the Window Box Kit is a lovely little mini project which you can really go to town with or keep simple. The window itself is very simple to assemble and then you can get down to the fun bit.

### What you Need

*Window Box Chipboard Kit or Window Box Downloadable Template, acrylic paints in your choice of colours, scrapbook papers, stamps, small piece of flower arranging oasis, paper flowers.*

The window frame was painted in a cream acrylic paint and the box and base were painted with a mix of greens to get the colour I wanted but you can of course use any colours you like. Yellow brads were used for window handles.

The windows were stamped using stamps from the Tapestry stamps range, using leaves and flowers in pink, lilac and green inks.

The curtains in this project have been cut from gingham paper using the free curtain template on the member pages. Little ribbons have been used as curtain ties.

The paper tulips are pushed into a rectangle of flower arranging oasis which neatly fits into the box. I only had two of these lovely paper flowers in my craft stash and have looked everywhere to find some more but they are very hard to find. You could use any other paper flowers but the key is to have some foliage as well as the flower, so the display looks more natural.

A simple stamped message using a Stampin Up 'Delight in Life' stamp on the front of the box completes this project.
