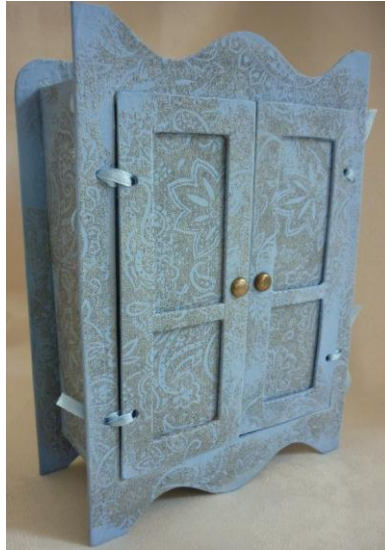


## Shabby Chic Wardrobe



Looking in the mirror each morning, I believe I do have the shabby look to perfection, I am just trying to get the chic bit sorted out now!

With this aim in mind, here is this weeks Masterclass project using the wonderfully versatile chipboard wardrobe kit.

### What you Need

Chipboard Wardrobe Kit or Downloadable Template, acrylic paint in your choice of colour, background stamp, Tim Holtz distressed embossing powder (Weathered Wood), vintage brads, scrapbook papers to line inside, small pieces of ribbon in co-ordinating color.

To get this fabulous shabby chic look, you need to paint your chipboard with a baby blue acrylic paint. We used the Kaisercraft range as they apply well to the chipboard. After this had dried, a white wash was brushed over the top.

The pieces were then stamped with a Versamark pad and Tim Holtz distressed embossing powder used on top (Weathered Wood). When you heat this up you can brush off some of the powder to give a lovely patchy weathered look. The stamp used was a Stampin Up background stamp with a paisley pattern.

Instead of scoring the doors, I have punched some holes using a Cropadile and threaded through some ribbon. This allows the doors to open fully but they do have to be put back into place each time you open them. I think this wardrobe could do with some bling to smarten it up so I will need to rummage in my box of tricks to find something suitable.
