

Vintage Wardrobe Re-visited



Don't worry, you are not seeing things, we have featured this project before. The vintage wardrobe with Moroccan Screen detailing, featured on an earlier blog post, returns with hinges this time.

These hinges have been cut from craftboard, holes punched in them and glued into place. Holes were punched on the frame and door of the cupboard and tiny brads pushed through the holes to fix the hinges. Adding hinges allows the doors to be opened fully, which is useful if you are opening and shutting them regularly to put things inside. Check the member pages for a new free template to make these hinges.

You can also use 12 mm brass hinges which you can get from the DIY store and are normally used for jewellery boxes or in dolls houses. We have some in the [webstore](#) now.



Brass hinges have been used on the cupboard shown above after it was covered with wood effect paper. Just punch holes on the frame and door using the hinges as a guide and then use brads to feed through the holes instead of screws, The brads do of course show on the reverse of the door and the back of the frame but are not too noticeable. The doors will open perfectly!
