

Hanging Ornament Card



It is Day 9 already, of our [24 Days of Christmas Series](#). For this blog post, we return to the simple aperture card. You really can't go wrong with a set of aperture cards in your stash. My favourite has to be the circle shape, as it lends itself to so many uses and is particularly beautiful for making simple Christmas cards.

The card above, simply uses a glitter die cut Christmas Ornament suspended on a thread and decorated with a twist of wire. Wire gives such a lovely delicate effect and is so simple to do. The ornament turns gently as it swings in the aperture and this produces such an interesting and stunning card.

I've finished my card off with a die cut trim and if you look, you can see that I didn't get it straight, but I'm not going to change it, as mistakes make us human, don't they? You could trim your card with a border sticker or just leave it plain.

If you don't have an aperture card, there is a template link on the free stuff pages which includes a sheet to print and cut two aperture A6 cards and some ornament shapes that you can use to cut and hang in your card. You can also use them in other ways, to make cards and tags, or even unusual ornaments to hang on your tree.
